Historic barns in Indiana are precious gems and architectural symbols of the state's rich agriculture. Nowhere is the agricultural heritage more deeply rooted than in Carroll County. This self guided driving tour will enable you to explore 10 historic barns in Carroll County and view many others on the 60 mile journey. Drive at your own pace through an area rich in history and beautiful rural countryside.

Highlights:

- Historic barns dating to 1850's
- Barn on the National Register of Historic Places
- Barns associated with the first commercialization of soybeans in the United States
- Three barns featured in artist Gwen Gutwein's Heritage Barn Series
- A featured 2016 Bicentennial Barn where you will be greeted by friendly alpacas

Your tour will start at the elegant 1916 Carroll County Courthouse located in the center of Delphi. In the rotunda you can purchase your ticket for \$12, receive the tour map and driving instructions, descriptions of the barns, and information about other places to see, restaurants and services.

You will not want to miss the unique Bicentennial Barn Quilt made by quilters representing barns from all 92 counties in the state. It will be on display in the Courthouse Rotunda, October 6 – 8, 9AM – 4PM.

A map and driving instructions describe nearby points of interest. The route will end at the historic Adams Mill near Cutler.

Event will take place rain or shine. Restrooms not provided at the barns.
